#### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

Yellowish shrub with untidy erect leafless branches. Branches rounded, 1–3.5 mm wide, with long yellow tips. Flowers small, pea-like, pink, in small clusters. Fruit a drooping dry pod containing 1–4 hard mottled seeds.

FLOWER COLOURS Violet/Purple, White

**LIFE CYCLE** Seeds are possibly dispersed by wind and granivory (Thorsen et al., 2009).

**carmichaelia**: After Carmichael, a botanist **petriei**: Named after Donald Petrie (1846 -1925), Scottish born Otago botanist
