ETYMOLOGY

chaerophyllum: From the Greek chairō 'to please' and phyllon 'leaf'

colensoi: Named after William Colenso (7 November 1811 - 10 February 1899) who was a Cornish Christian missionary to New Zealand, and also a printer, botanist, explorer and politician.
