BRIEF DESCRIPTION

Characterised by the corticolous habit; marginal phyllidia; a non-corticate lower surface; and norstictic acid (K+ yellow→red) in the medulla.

DISTRIBUTION

North Island: Northland (Kaitaia, Helena Bay), Auckland (Dome Valley, Puhoi).

Known also from West Africa, Brazil, and Australia.

HABITAT

On Cordyline.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Lobes slightly disjunct or adjacent, \pm plane, not ascending, with short lateral lobes. **Upper surface** even, squamulose. **Squamules** mainly marginal, rarely laminal, dissected. **Lower surface** ecorticate, pale to brownish. **Apothecia** laminal, sessile to subpedicellate, thalline exciple squamulose, squamules long and deeply dissected, disc brown or brownblack, matt. **Ascospores** with sporoblastidia, 37-53 \times 18-25 μ m.

Chemistry: Atranorin, zeorin, and norstictic acid.

SIMILAR TAXA

Similar to other members of this genus but defined by its phyllidiate thallus and K+ yellow-red chemistry.

SUBSTRATE

Corticolous

ETYMOLOGY

heterodermia: From the Greek heteros (other, different) and derma (a skin or hide), in reference to the presence or absence of a lower cortex

appendiculata: Appendiculate, with small appendages or projections, hanging in small fragments
