# **BRIEF DESCRIPTION**

Shrub with usually multiple erect stems; mature leaves dull green, glabrous above, woolly-white below; obscurely crenate margins. Corolla cream-white; flowers noted for containing brown nectar, attractive to birds, insects.

The stems and leaves are rather similar to those of some Buddleja species, such as B. davidii.
