ETYMOLOGY

nemesia: The name "Nemesia" is derived from the name "Nemesion", the generic name of a similar plant.

fruticans: The epithet "fruticans" is derived from the Latin word "frutex" which means a shrubby plant.

New Zealand specimens of Nemesia fruticans are probably not pure but of hybrid origin for this reason we designate the few collections / records known with the abbreviation 'cv' (cultivar). An exact parentage for the wild plants in New Zealand is as yet unknown (P.M. Datson pers. comm.).
