repens: From Latin repere meaning to creep, means creeping

strictus: From the Latin strictus 'upright, stiff'

TAXONOMIC NOTES

The familial relationships of *Samolus* are unclear. The genus has variously been placed in the monotypic family Samolaceae, a broadened circumscription of Theophrastaceae, and Primulaceae. Here we follow the treatment in APG III, which recognises a broadened circumscription of Primulaceae that includes Theophrastaceae and Samolaceae.
