DETAILED DESCRIPTION

The fruiting body consists of a large, thick disc, up to 10 cm diameter, and narrowly attached at the centre. It is flabby and jelly-like, and heavy to hold. The upper surface is smooth while the lower surface is even or wrinkled. It is black beneath, bright orange-brown or apricot above, dark grey within. The spores are colourless, ellipsoidal, $42-50 \times 16-18 \mu m$, and verrucose.

FRUITING

Known from two collection made in April and August.

SUBSTRATE

On dead branch on living tree of Podocarpus totara, and on fallen Prumnopitys ferruginea (miro).
